The Cleburne County High School Band Program

The Cleburne County High School Band program consists of the Marching Tiger Band, Concert Band, Intermediate Band, Beginning Bands, Percussion Ensemble and the CCHS Jazz Band. Students also have the opportunity to audition and perform in several honor groups and solo & ensemble performances each year.

Membership in band is open to students who have successfully demonstrated their proficiency level in the spring of the preceding year. Members of the band participate in both the Marching Tiger Band and the Concert Band during first and second semester respectively.

In addition, successful completion of one year in the band program satisfies the Arts requirement for graduation and entitles the student to receive the PE Credit exemption.

The CCHS Marching Tiger Band proudly performs at all home and away football games, community events, parades, and out of state trips. The band also participates in multiple competitions during the fall season. Marching Band begins in late July with a two week Band Camp. Once school is in session, rehearsals are held daily during the marching season from 3:00-5:00. Members of the marching band must be proficient on their instrument and demonstrate the drive and determination necessary to be in a group constantly striving for improvement.

The Cleburne County Concert Band is the highest level band at the High School performing advanced instrumental literature. Membership in the Concert Band is limited to students who participate in marching season. Students in Concert Band participate in two concerts during the year. Concert Band members are encouraged to perform at AMEA Adjudicated events, such as Solo and Ensemble, and have often received "Superior" ratings. Concerts are scheduled for December and March each year.

Students also have the option of participating in the CCHS Jazz Ensemble. Jazz Ensemble meets 2-3 times per week. Membership in Jazz Ensemble is open, by audition or recommendation of the director, to musicians on the following instruments: trumpet, saxophone, trombone, guitar, bass, percussion and keyboard. Enrollment is limited by instrumentation. Music literature studied and performed includes jazz, rock, swing, pop, ballads, and fusion.

Intermediate Band is typically for 7th grade students only. Membership in this group is based upon completion of the beginning band class the previous year. The Intermediate Band participates in two concerts during the year. Concerts are scheduled for December and March each year.

The Cleburne County Bands currently offer Beginning Band throughout the feeder schools beginning in 6th grade. Students are introduced to reading music and performing on an instrument. All Beginning Band students are required to provide their own instrument and materials to participate in the beginning groups.

Cleburne County Career Technical School (CCCTS)

Students in tenth, eleventh and twelfth grades have the opportunity to attend the Cleburne County Career Technical School (CCCTS) for at least two periods a day. Students can choose to take classes in the following areas:Auto Service Technology, Auto Collision Repair, Building Construction, Business Education, Cosmetology, Electrical, Health Science, and Welding.

Auto Service Technology: Students obtain classroom and shop experience in automotive technology repair. Students will learn to identify and use tools and to read and understand technical manuals. Auto Collision Repair: Students learn: classroom and shop experience in the repair of a damaged vehicle. Included are : Metal Straightening, Welding with wire and plastic welder, Smoothing areas by filling, grinding, or sanding, painting, and replacing body parts, Upholstery, trim and glass. Building Construction: Curriculum designed to provide students with job market skills in carpentry, and building construction. Certification Offered: NCCER Core, NCCER Building Construction 1 and 2 Teacher/ Teacher Email: Ken Hester/ Kenneth.hester@cleburneschools.net

Business Education: Students will gain the knowledge and skills necessary to enter the workforce. Students that successfully complete this program have enhanced computer skills through the business technology applications and multimedia course. In addition, students learn about finance, management, business law, and accounting.

Electrical: This course provides specialized classroom and laboratory experience leading to the entry-level electrical status in residential, commercial, and industrial applications. Health Science: This course prepares students to successfully enter a career in healthcare or a college health related curriculum. As student progress through the program, they are given community-based clinical assignments that provide observation and experiences in various healthcare specialty areas.
