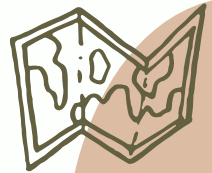
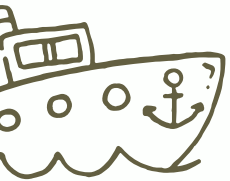
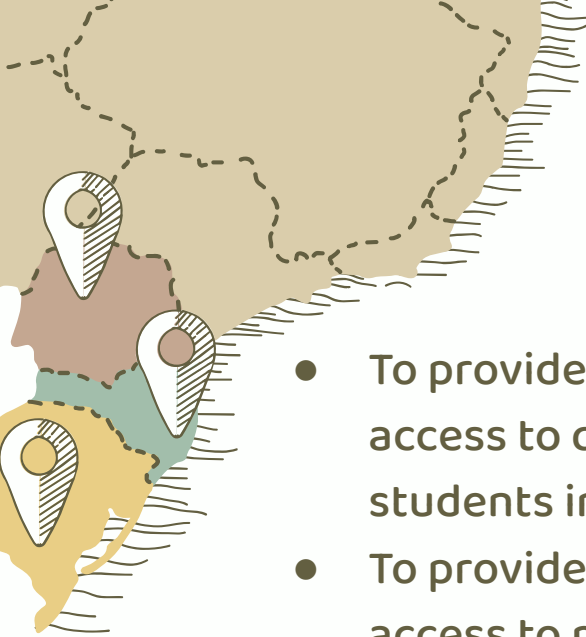


What is Title One?

- Title 1 is funding we receive from the Federal Government.
 - We get funding based on how many students are on free and reduced lunch. This is why the forms are stressed at the beginning of each school year to complete rather you qualify or not.
 - The purpose of Title 1 is to ensure that every student has a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high quality education.

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Title One Goals

Testing:



- Reading:

- Tested weekly using our new Open Court Reading Program. This is tested online to prepare the students for state testing.

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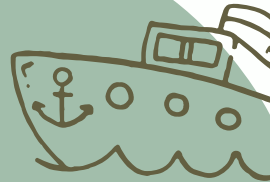
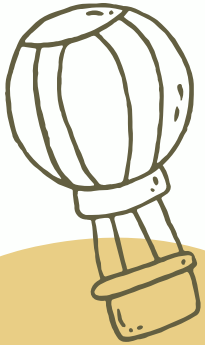
- Math:

- As we complete each chapter, the students are given a teacher-created assessment that aligns with the standards that have been taught in that particular chapter.
- Mid-chapter checkpoints are quizzes that are used to assess student knowledge throughout the chapter.
- Timed fluency grades are given to students as they master their multiplication facts



Grading:

- Students must maintain an average of 60 or above to be promoted to the 4th grade.
- Star grade equivalency will be used for a true picture of a student's knowledge.
- Literacy Act: if a child is not on 3rd grade level according to state testing they have a potential to be retained. This is a state-mandated test.



How can you help?

- Attend school events
- Check email, remind messages, and your child's folder daily.
- Go over homework with your child.
- Practice multiplication math facts at home with flashcards or using their reflex.com account.
