### Alabama State Department of Education Policy Use of Digital Device during the Administration of a Secure Test Student Policy

The possession of a digital device (including but not limited to cell phones, MP3 players, cameras, or other telecommunication devices capable of capturing or relaying information) is strictly prohibited during the administration of a secure test. If a student is observed using a digital device during the administration of a secure test, testing for the student will cease, the device will be confiscated and is subject to search, the student will be dismissed from testing, and the student's test will be invalidated.

Local education agency (LEA) personnel will make all students, parents, and/or guardians aware of this prohibition through inclusion of this policy in the Student Code of Conduct Handbook and other regularly used modes of communication.

## Code of Conduct

### INTRODUCTION

The Cleburne County Board of Education believes that instruction should occur in an environment conducive to learning because effective quality instruction requires orderly procedures and discipline. The purpose of this handbook, as well as the enforcement of its rules, is to ensure the presence of a safe, friendly, and professional atmosphere in which students and school personnel work cooperatively toward mutually accepted goals. Acting in the best interest of all the residents of Cleburne County, the Cleburne County Board of Education requires principals, faculties, staff, students, parents, and guardians to comply with this adopted ***Student Code of Conduct and Attendance*** handbook.

The contents of this handbook:

- Describe roles of the home, student, school, and school personnel.
- Student rights and responsibilities.
- Define student discipline in the context of the Board of Education's Philosophy.
- Identify formal disciplinary actions.
- Identify classifications of violations and describe procedures for disciplinary actions.
- Standardize procedures for administering formal disciplinary actions.
- Conform to the mandates provided in the Education for All Handicapped Children Act; the Rehabilitation Act of 1973; and the Alabama Exceptional Child Act.
